<u>The Voice of our MD:</u> We have now done 3 Art Deco weekends and someone said to me over the weekend that I was amazingly calm during the day. Thinking back to 2017 in the Century Theatre Napier I can see that the calm has been generated by the members of the choir.

In 2017 we had approximately 3 hours to get the choir used to singing together, practise getting on and off stage, set up the risers (which were a bigger challenge than the singing) listen to the OSH briefing and

prepare ourselves emotionally for the big moment.

People turned up half way through the rehearsal and even for just the last 30 minutes, people argued about where they should stand, many opinions were voiced about how to get on and off stage and a lot of loud talking was done by just about everyone.

<u>This</u> year, we had 4 hours in total and we didn't use it all. We still had to get the choir used to singing together, practise getting on and off stage, (no risers thankfully), listen to the OSH briefing and prepare ourselves emotionally for the big moment.



The difference is, you were all there from the beginning of rehearsal, a suitable volume was maintained when not singing, no-one complained about positioning and the whole thing ran smoothly. Not only has the sound improved but so has the professionalism, thank you.
